- Ordinance 21-06, which establishes new fencing standards, was adopted at the December 7th Commissioners meeting following a prior public hearing and review of public comments on the ordinance. The ordinance is available for review at www.queenstown-md.com or in the Town Office.

CUL-DE-SAC PARKING – Recent complaints have been reported regarding parking of vehicles incorrectly in town cul-de-sacs, especially on Olde Point Lane and Wick Court. We want to remind all residents that according to State law, vehicles “stopped or parked on a two-way roadway shall be stopped or parked parallel to the right-hand curb or edge of the roadway, with its right-hand wheels within 12 inches of that curb or edge of the roadway.” This applies to all town streets where parking is permitted, including cul-de-sacs. Parking nose/rear to curb or in other manners can create safety and maneuvering issues and is prohibited. Future violations will be enforced by the QAC Sheriff's Dept. and/or by the Town.
